## Entry Requirements

1. Students must be 18 years of age or over.
2. Students are required to successfully complete the Language Literacy and Numeracy test and achieve Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework across reading, writing, learning, oral communication and numeracy skill. Prospective International students who provide an IELTS of 5.5 or its equivalent will be deemed as meeting the English language entry requirements.
3. Satisfactorily complete a pre-training review interview to determine student's suitability for the chosen course.
4. Students are required to be physically fit to carry out some tasks as required by the course.
5. Students are required to have access to a computer and internet in order to complete assessments and read information on the units of competency.
6. Additional entry requirements may apply to specific qualifications.

## Work Placement

To gain this qualification, successful completion of **120 hours work placement** is required at an accredited aged care facility. Students are responsible for obtaining a work placement venue. Students will be informed of this at the interview.

You will be responsible for finding an accredited/approved facility for the work placement component. Once you have found the facility the RTO will assist you to finalise this arrangement. The RTO will also engage with the facility on your behalf to ensure it meets the workplace requirements for your supervision, insurance and assessment.

## How to Enrol
